

# Some thoughts by the Principal on the visit by UKM Islamic Studies Department Students to STM 有关国民大学伊斯兰研究系学生来访的反思

On 23 April 2012, about 40 students from UKM came to STM under "The Islam and Christian Goodwill Interaction Programme" (PTS-2011-101 Religious Interaction Research Project). The purpose of the visit and interaction was to promote "Muhibbah" (friendship) and better understanding of each other's faith. We had a wonderful experience of meeting and sharing with one another. Whilst we are aware of the sensitivity of religious dialogue amongst some circles, for the sake of God and society, the different religious communities must be courageous to pursue open and friendly dialogue for better understanding. For fruitful interaction and understanding, these two aspects are important:

We must be courageous to clearly state our faith. One must be faithful to one's own religious tradition. There is
no need to downplay the uniqueness of one's faith. On the contrary, it is better to explain our doctrines and
practices clearly so that others can come to understand and to appreciate our beliefs.

 We must listen attentively to the other's faith. Religious dialogue, in fact, is not an occasion for debate or converting the other side. It is to listen with patience and humility. In the process of understanding the other side, we seek to clarify the different thoughts and to remove any existing prejudices. Hopefully, we can journey together on this understanding of one another. We can agree to disagree!

As Christians, 1 Peter 2:9 reminds us: "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light." We are called to be witnesses out of the deep experience of the life-changing power of Jesus the Messiah.



对于基督徒来说,我们要谨记彼前2:9所说,"然而你们是蒙拣选的族类,是君尊的祭司,是圣洁的国民,是属神的子民,为要叫你们宣扬那召你们出黑暗入奇妙光明者的美德"。藉着经历主耶稣这位弥赛亚而领受到改变生命的大能,我们被呼召成为他的见证。



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# New Book: Lamentations Made Simple

The purpose of this book, like its three earlier predecessors in the series, is to

help the general Christian reader to be familiar with one of the books of the OT, i.e., the Book of Lamentations. Many Christians have not read through the book nor heard good exegetical sermons preached from it except for the occasional verses from chapter 3. It is a book which remains 'sealed' to them. If they may have faintly heard about the book, it would often be in connection with the prophet Jeremiah as the pulpit preacher would generally describe the book as the 'Lamentations of Jeremiah'.

The Book of Lamentations, however, goes deeper than what a cursory reading would reveal. If one is sensitive to the different voices in the book, he or she will realize that there is much treasure to be drawn from its five chapters. The book is short in terms of its length but it is not short on its theology or continuing relevance to the modern world. It is one of the five books which the Jews would annually take out and read at one of the religious festivals in their calendar year. They probably have been reading this book for the last 2,500 years without fail. Just pause and imagine what place this book has in the collective memory and imagination of the Jewish people. The same cannot be said for the general Christian reader. We have lost this centuries-old tradition of reading the book annually as a community. We no longer cry to the LORD for Him to 'look and see' the distressing situations we find ourselves in. We have become 'muted' as the language of lament and repentance is increasingly disappearing from our communal worship on Sundays.

This series entitled *The Old Testament Made Simple* serves to help God's people be familiar with the many books of the OT. The format is designed to make studying the OT enjoyable and relatively simple.

- (1) to continue accrediting our Bachelor of Theology, Bachelor of Divinity, and Master of Divinity degrees
- (2) to accredit our Master of Theology degree.

In their report, the accreditation team highlighted their appreciation of the warm welcome and hospitality of the STM community. We are thankful to God for the development of STM through the years. We look to you for continuous support and prayer as we endeavor to respond faithfully to God's calling and mission in this nation.

# New Chinese (TEE) Theological Education by Extension Program

With the launch of the Chinese Theological Education by Extension (TEE) program in 2003, STM has provided quality off campus theological education in Chinese to churches and christians. STM is launching the Bachelor of Theology in TEE for those who have completed the Diploma of Christian Ministry (DipCM). To complete the BTh (TEE), a further 66 credit hours are needed (30 credit hours of compulsory subjects, 6 credit hours of church field education, and 30 credit hours of electives). To graduate with the BTh (TEE) thus requires a total of 126 credit hours. The above visit initially began as an opportunity for two groups of students from UKM and STM to dialogue about the Christian faith and Christology as understood in both religions. The Department of National Unity and Integration Malaysia soon became interested and decided to fully sponsor and promote the programme. On our side, there were some feelings of apprehension because of the very nature of the programme. However, the Principal, Rev Dr Ezra Kok, was a constant source of encouragement during the planning process. STM saw it as a valuable opportunity to be able to engage in a meaningful dialogue with our Muslim counterparts.

For STM, the day began with the Principal, students, and the lecturer-advisors gathering together for prayer and preparation. There were 15 student participants from STM from both the English and Chinese all student years, Departments representing programmes, races, and origins. The programme started with the arrival of the students from UKM at noon. Among the Muslim students from UKM were three Christian students from the UKM Christian Fellowship (PERKEB). Three graduate students from the International Islamic University (UIA) also attended, two of whom are doing studies in Comparative Religion. A few graduate lecturers from UKM were in the group as well as a few officers from the Institute for the Understanding of Islam Malaysia (IKIM). A few members from the Working Committee for Joint









Activities, Department of National Unity and Integration Malaysia also attended the programme as observers.

The agenda included a short tour of STM Campus. The Library turned out to be the highlight of the tour as many of the students were interested in the Library holdings. At 1:15pm, the Muslim students performed their Zohor prayers in the MPH. After prayers, at 1:30pm, all had a sumptuous halal lunch in the STM Canteen. At 2:15pm, the programme was officially opened. Mr Yusri Bin Mohamad Ramli and Rev Chew Kean Kee, advisors from both the UKM and STM sides respectively, gave their welcoming speeches. At the end of the opening ceremony, the students were divided into five discussion groups consisting of about 10 UKM students and 3 STM students. They discussed and dialogued for almost two hours in an atmosphere of mutual respect. The closing ceremony was held at 5pm. Closing remarks were given by Mr Anaz Fahmi bin Md Isa of UKM and Mr Kelvin Jawa from the STM students. The Principal, Rev Dr Ezra Kok, gave the closing speech and thanked all participants and observers for their presence in this historic event in STM's history. He encouraged all parties to continue to learn as much as possible from the programme and to maintain the fellowship between both sets of students in the future.



The Muslim UKM students were very eager to listen, learn, understand, and digest. They all had a basic understanding of Christianity from their course as well as from their previous interactions with Christians and many of them came prepared with challenging theological questions. In retrospect, it was also a good learning opportunity for many of the STM student participants. They should be applauded for the wonderful way they answered the questions asked and the camaraderie they showed while they were interacting with the UKM students. They showed great maturity in their responses. Many came with butterflies in their stomach and nothing more than head knowledge but God was gracious to all of them and filled them with His Spirit which enabled them to speak boldly as He willed them to. To that end, it is hoped that similar programmes be initiated and encouraged in the near future to continue the dialogue process and deepen the understanding of each other's faiths.

#### Muslim students in path-breaking visit to STM

A path-breaking and memorable occasion happened at Seminari Theoloji Malaysia (STM) on 23 April 2012.

About 40 students from the Department of Theology and Philosophy, the Faculty of Islamic Studies of Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) came by and were warmly received by more than 20 students and some faculty

members of STM for the visit which went from noon to 5pm.

The students were led by their lecturer En Yusri Mohamad Ramli who is teaching the course "Agama Kristian di Nusantara" (i.e. The Christian Religion in Southeast Asia). Among them were several doctoral students as well.

The visit was also sponsored by the Cabinet-appointed Committee for the Promotion of Understanding and Harmony among Religious Adherents and also the Department for National Unity and Integration.

Two members of the Committee, Rev Dr Thomas Philips, a Vice-President of the Malaysian Consultative Council of Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Sikhism and Taoism, and Mr Tan Kong Beng, the Executive Secretary of the Christian Federation of Malaysia (CFM), were on hand to lend every encouragement to the students.

The highlight of the visit was a dialogue session in small groups between the Muslim students and STM students. The topic was "Jesus in the Islamic and Christian perspective". The lively discussions which lasted 2 ½ hours held the students in rapt attention as they listened to each other and which was occasioned with laughter in the mixed discussion groups. Some of the students even exchanged mobile numbers at the end of the visit.

The STM students were led by Kelvin Jawa who was the host of the visit while Rev Chew Kean Kee and Rev Dr Joseph Komar lent their help and support to the students.

Earlier on, the Muslim students were given a tour of the seminary facilities and especially the library where some students expressed interest to come and borrow the library resources. Then there was the communal lunch together at the seminary canteen and later on the Muslim students were allowed the use of the chapel to have their "zohor" prayers.

The Deputy Director of the Institute of Islamic Understanding Malaysia (IKIM), Prof Datin Dr Azizan binti Baharuddin, came by later in the afternoon and together with some of us we had some honest and lively discussions on inter-faith dialogue and engagement. There was agreement to work together on "dialogue of life" sessions on issues which impact all of us as Malaysians. Prof Azizan said she would welcome Christian students to visit IKIM also.

In the closing ceremony, Rev Dr Ezra Kok spoke of the momentous occasion of the visit and asked if STM students could be invited to visit the Faculty of Theology and Philosophy at UKM for which he received a re-sounding note of assurance from the UKM students.

After eight years as a visiting scholar at STM, what are the most important things I've learnt? That if you want siew pow you must come to Seremban. In contrast to the 1960's and 1980's when the faculty at STM was dominated by overseas lecturers, when I arrived in 2004, all the faculty was Malaysian. When I came, it was to fill in while a faculty member was on study leave and it has been a joy during my time at STM to be able to celebrate three colleagues receiving their doctorates.

My role has been as a partner and I came to work with the church in Malaysia. Our goal is to prepare students to be faithful servants of Jesus Christ in the churches they go to. I believe that coming from a different country and culture has helped to broaden and enrich their experience at STM. I know I have certainly been blessed by the diverse cultural and denominational backgrounds of the students I have taught. For this reason it is a major concern of the seminary that we are no longer able to accept overseas students. So please continue to pray that a way will be found for overseas students to get their visas. Having recognised our



differences, one thing I have learnt from my time in Malaysia is that what we have in common as followers of Jesus far outweighs these differences.





What are the Stations of the Cross? The 'Stations of the Cross' is also known as the 'Way of the Cross', 'Way of Sorrows' or simply 'The Way'. It is an artistic representation by depicting as various 'stations' the series of events before Jesus was crucified on the cross. In participating and going through the various stations, it becomes an occasion for reflection and solemn prayer. Once in a few years, Miss Ho Gaik Kim, the Chapel Warden, will organize the STM students to work together to set up the Stations of the Cross. For this year, twelve Stations were prepared. Because of the limitation in space, only a few photos are shown below.

Station 1 – Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matt 26:36-41)

Station 2 – Jesus, betrayed by Judas, is arrested (Mark 14:43-46)

Station 3 – Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin (Luke 22:63-71)

Station 4 - Jesus is denied by Peter (Matt 26:69-75)

Station 5 – Jesus is judged by Pilate (Mark 15:1-5, 15)

Station 6 – Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns (John 19: 1-3)

Station 7 – Jesus bears the cross (John 19:6, 15-17)
Station 8 – Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem (Luke 23:27-31)

Station 9 – Jesus is crucified (Luke 23:33-34)

Station 10 – Jesus speaks to His mother and the disciple (John 19:25-27)

Station 11 – Jesus dies on the cross (Luke 23:44-46)

Station 12 – Jesus is placed in the tomb (Matt 27:57-60)

Everyone is encouraged to take time at each station to reflect and meditate on the significance of the event in their lives. Three churches came this year to participate in the Stations of the Cross. When STM organizes the event in the near future, you are most welcome to come and experience the Stations of the Cross for yourselves!

第七站: 耶稣背十字架 (约19:6, 15-17)


第八站:耶稣遇见耶路撒冷的妇女(路23:27-31)

第九站: 耶稣被钉十字架(路23:33-34)


第十站: 耶稣向母亲和门徒说话(约19:25-27)
