Rev Dr. Lee Chul Woo is a Global Missions Society Korean missionary since 2013 teaching various seminaries in Malaysia. He is married to Moon Gyung and have three grown-up children. He also served as missionary with the OM ship Doulos from 1986-1988, and to Philippines (1994-2012) ministering at Koinonia Theological Seminary as Professor, Academic Dean and Seminary Director (1996-2011). He was also a visiting professor to Theological Center for Asia, Singapore, and Torch Trinity Graduate School of Theology, Seoul Korea during this period. His educational background: MDiv from Chong Shin Theological Seminary, Seoul, Korea (1986), MTh in New Testament Studies from Covenant Theological Seminary, USA (1993) and DTh in New Testament Studies from Stellenbosch University, RSA (2000).

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class seeks to focus on the distinctive features, genre, structure and themes in each book of the New Testament. It will also examine some of the background issues pertinent to NT, with particular emphasis on their socio-economic, religious, historical, political and cultural contexts and the particular occasion and purpose behind each of NT books. In addition to an overview of each book, a detailed study of selected texts will be conducted to enable the students to better understand some of the key passages and to draw implications for life and ministry in the Church.
